NCPA Foundation's Outer Steps For Disaster Preparedness

Assess Potential Threats:

Identify potential threats that could impact your pharmacy.

Develop an Emergency Plan:

Outline procedures for evacuation, sheltering, and communication with staff/patients/suppliers. Include current images of your property with your emergency plan.

Secure Critical Supplies:

Ensure essential medications, first-aid kits, and medical supplies are prepared. Secure a backup power source, like a generator, and communication devices (i.e. satellite phones).

Train Your Staff:

Practice your emergency procedures so staff are familiarized with their roles in an emergency.

Stay Informed:

Monitor weather alerts, maintain contact with pharmacy organizations, and adapt plans as needed.


Small Business Loans
